## Sally wins on a different circuit

SALLY Powley, co-owner of the Anglia Karting Centre at North Pickenham, proved she was a fast mover on foot as well as four wheels during a supermarket trolley dash.

Helped by her son Daniel (12), she collected 365 worth of Christmas goodies in just 90 seconds from the shelves at Swaffham's Safeway store last week.

Mrs Powley (41), of St Andrews Close, Holme Hale, won the dash – her first big prize win – in Swaffham and Litcham Home Hospice Support Group's Christmas draw.

She and Daniel, a Hamond's High School pupil, toured the aisles in advance, picking out items they wanted and placing them to one side in heaps.

They also positioned three trolleys at strategic points.

Under competition rules, they were not allowed to collect alcohol, cigarettes or electrical goods. But they filled the trolleys with meat, groceries, cat food, cakes and crackers to set themselves up for Christmas.

Mrs Powley said: "I was the pusher and Daniel was the filler, and I got in a panic trying to remember what was down each aisle."

She added: "I asked them if I could bring a go-kart because it would be brilliant on the shop floor to get round quickly – but they wouldn't let me!"

Hospice group co-ordinator Mrs Debbie Harfield said the charity was "very happy" with the money raised.

It totalled 1,928 from this year's draw, after paying for Mrs Powley's shopping bill and 75 and 50 Safeway vouchers for the two runners-up.
